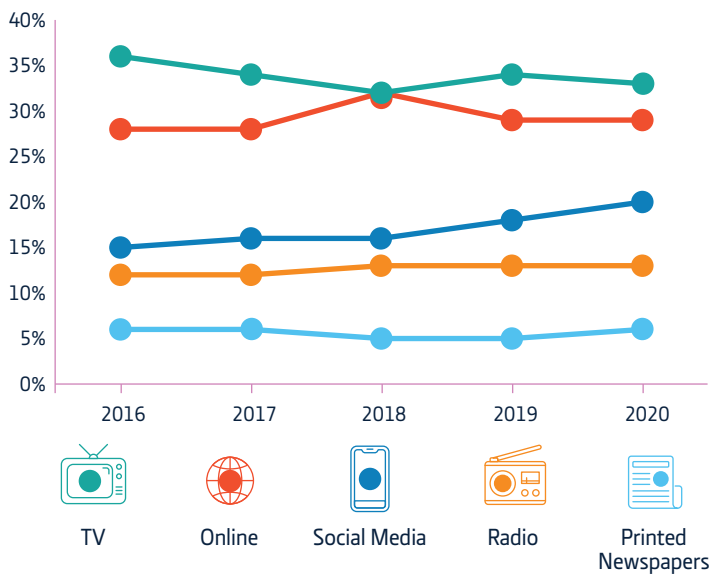

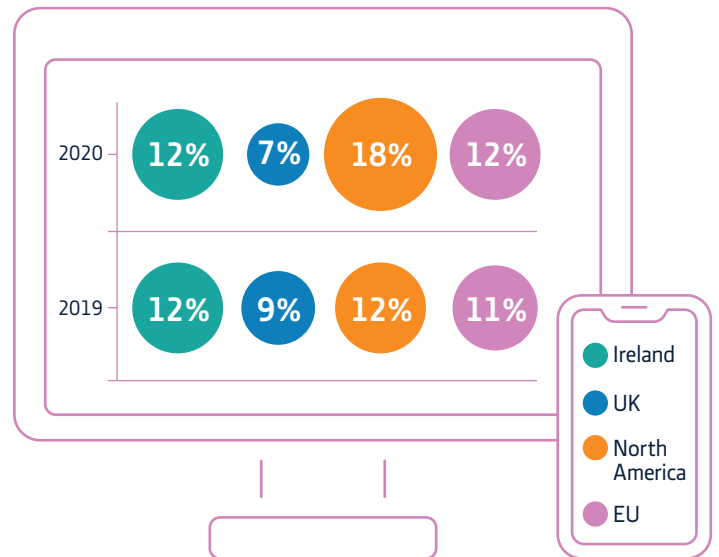

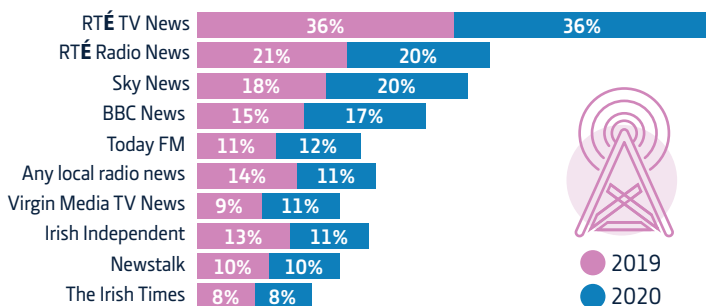
Q How do Irish people access news?



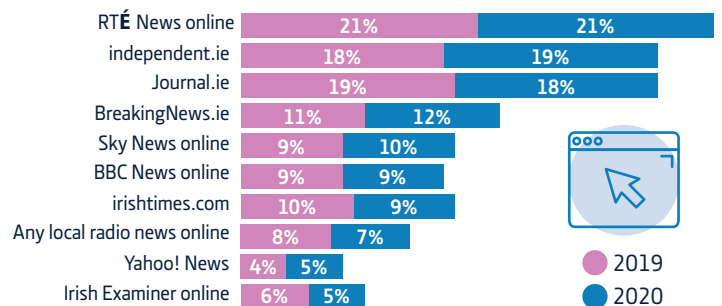
Q Do people pay for or access paid for online news content?



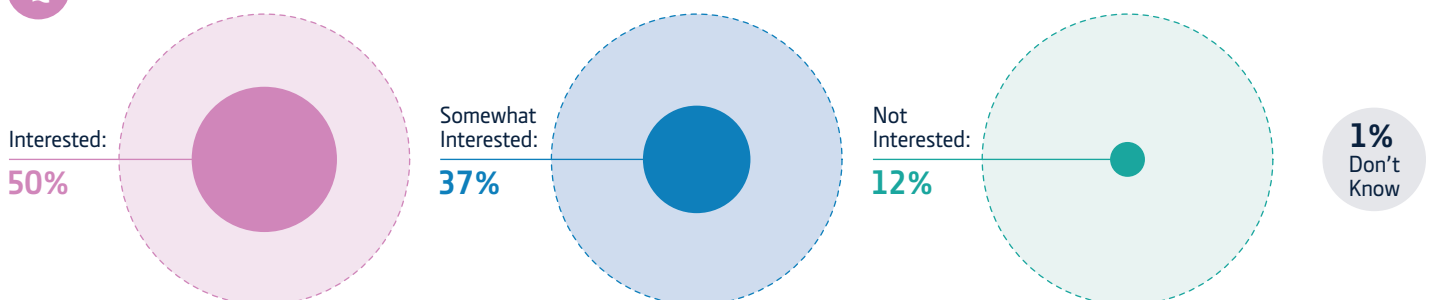
Q What are Irish people's main traditional news sources?

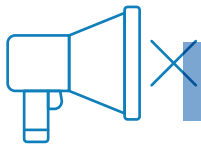


Q What are Irish people's main digital news sources?



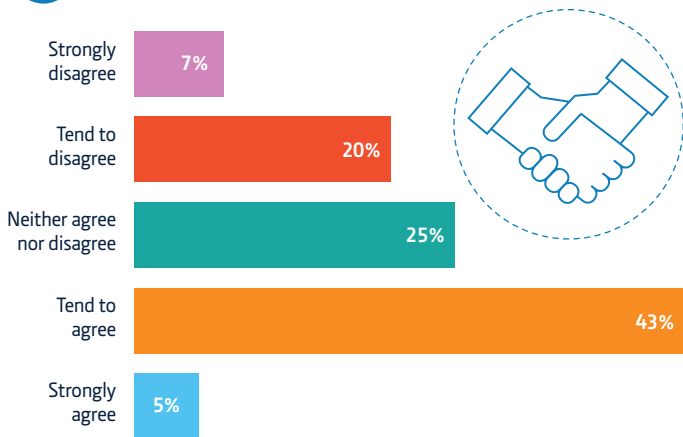
Q How interested are Irish people in local news?



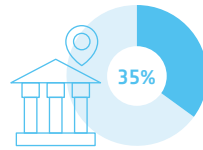

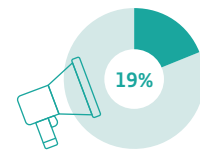
Q Do Irish people trust news most of the time?



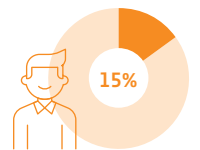
Q With regards to false or misleading information, which information sources are Irish people most concerned about?



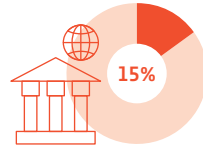

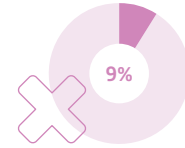

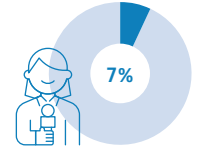

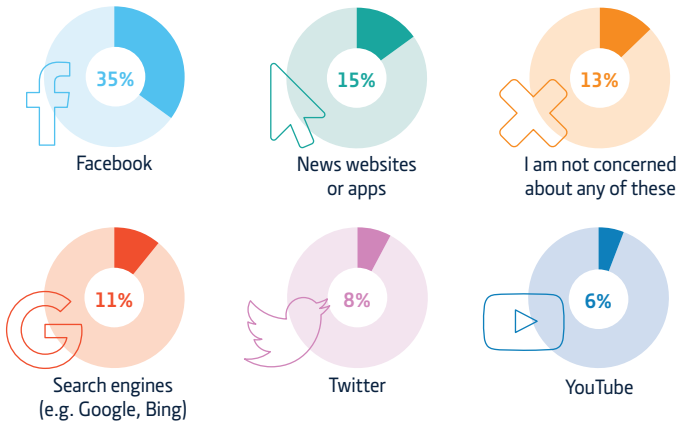

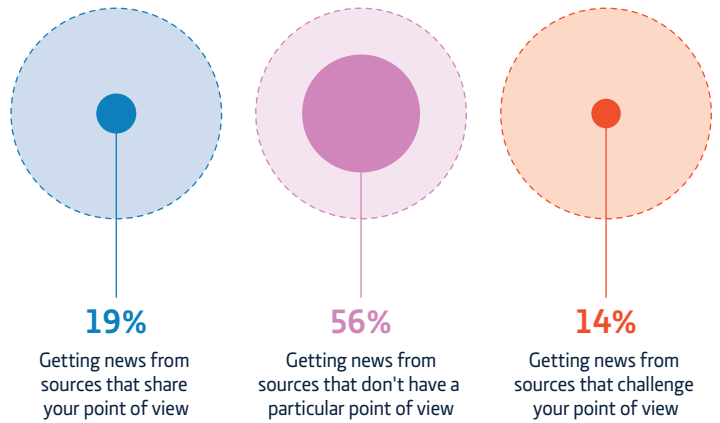

Q What type of sources do Irish people prefer to get their news from?

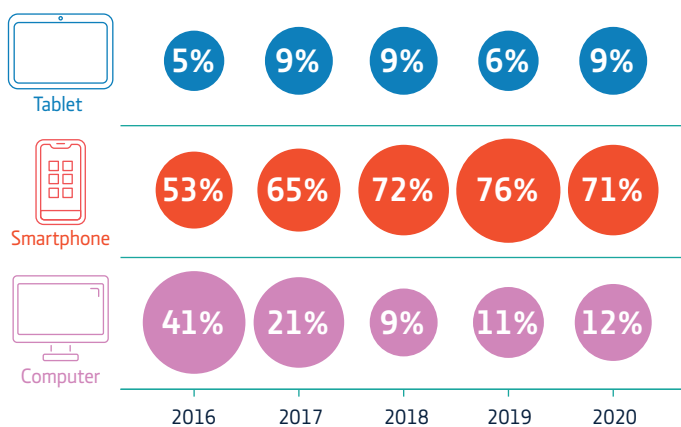

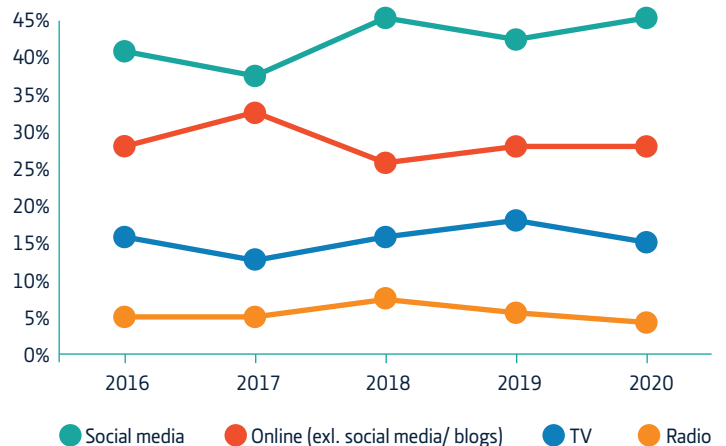
